

A message to the United Nations

The decision issued on April 21 by OPCW to suspend the membership of Assad regime after it was proven that it had used chemical weapons against civilians in more than one city in Syria was an important and effective step in the path of penalizing the criminal regime and its officials accountable for the crime of using these weapons classified as weapons of Mass destruction and forbidden to use it according to UN Security Council resolutions. We welcome this decision and place it in the field of preventing impunity as stipulated in international law, the legitimacy of human rights, and the United Nations Charter.

Investigations conducted by United Nations committees and several independent, impartial, and credible bodies have proven that the criminal regime used chemical weapons in the attacks of Eastern Ghouta (2013) and Saraqib (2018) and other attacks exceeded hundreds ones, and here we recall that the UN Security Council had issued Resolution (2118) for the year (2013), which underscores within its articles and content that in the event of non-compliance with this decision within the stipulated cases that include the transfer of chemical weapons without permission, or the use of chemical weapons by anyone in the Syrian Arab Republic, it would impose "Chapter VII" measures.

Accordingly, we the Syria Future Combination call on the Security Council and the member states, led by the United States of America, France, and Britain, to take the following:

Activating Clause (21) of Resolution No. (2118) and taking punitive measures under "Chapter Seven" of the United Nations Charter and pushing Assad regime to disclose its stockpile of



chemical weapons that several investigations have proven possessed despite the false claim "They got rid of their stocks completely."

Freezing the membership of Assad Syrian regime in the United Nations and all its bodies and institutions, after violating its charter and provisions relating to human rights and the prohibition of targeting civilians and the use of prohibited weapons against them.

Work to activate the principle of non-impunity, impose harsh punishments on the Assad regime and its officials accountable commensurate with the horror they have committed against the defenseless Syrian people, and start a real path that guarantees justice and prosecutes members of the Assad regime for their crimes against humanity, including genocide. Torture, arrest, and deportation.

Work to ensure that the international community, represented by its official institutions and its active states, bears the responsibility of protecting the Syrian people in a way that prevents them from being exposed to more war crimes that Assad regime and its officials have been committed and planning for.



Work to push for a political solution in accordance with Resolution (2254) issued by the Security Council, which Reiterating on establishing an inclusive transitional governing body while paves the way for bringing criminals to punishment.

In conclusion, we emphasize that the international disregard for the tragedy of the Syrian people over a decade, and overlooked the crimes committed by the criminal Assad regime, have contributed to prolonging the crime, which is one of the most hideous and bloody holocausts in history, and pushed the Assad regime and its allies to practice a hugely indiscriminate violence. this has exacerbated the humanitarian conditions of the Syrian citizens, who are still hoping for an international action dictated by international laws and charters and the legitimacy of human rights, today, the world witnesses the criminal Assad regime's persistence in underestimating relevant international decisions, as it takes unilateral steps that contradict the texts of the decisions related to the Syrian file. Here he is calling for presidential elections that explicitly contravene the terms of Resolution (2254), which requires formatting a transitional governing body that paves the way for conducting presidential and parliamentary elections under UN supervision. This necessitates taking deterrent measures by the international system against Assad regime, who prolonged the suffering of the Syrian people by ruling them with iron and fire, also preventing them from reaching to the political life that the free peoples of the world aspire to, to live under the auspices of a democratic civil state.
